LITERATURE - PLAIN LANGUAGE BIG BOOK 1999 SOMO SE TOURTE

Plain Language Big Book: A Tool for Reading Alcoholics Anonymous (draft title).

o The following are notes taken directly from a February 20, 2024 PowerPoint presentation titled Plain Language Big Book - the Journey so far.

July 2021, at the meeting of the Trustees Literature Committee, a subcommittee was created to track the development of the PLBB. Noting the Conference Committee's request that the book be "developed in a way that is accessible and relatable to as wide of an audience as possible."

Subcommittee adopted the name "TABB" (Tools to Access the Big Book) and worked with the AAWS Publishing Department to review and find potential writers for the project. A formal Request for Information was sent out to

vendors with the following goals/outcomes:

"We seek a full plain language translation of an abridged Alcoholics Anonymous. The final work product must be accessible to readers at a middly agains meeting fifth grade reading level."

"The translation as a whole must capture the welcoming and inclusive spirit of Alcoholics Anonymous and inspire a sense of

belonging and hope in the alcoholic seeking help."

There were 16 affirmative responses. The TABB committee plus three members from AAWS Publishing (all AA members) - selected six vendors (writers) which were then hired to translate Chapter 5, and, if possible, a few select passages. The samples were independently read and ranked by TABB and the Publishing team members and a writer was chosen.

The anonymous writer completed a draft plain language translation of Chapters 1 through 6. These chapters were presented to 2023 Conference Members. Members were permitted to review the draft for 60 minutes in a controlled environment: a designated room; with no cellphones or recording devices allowed; and monitored by members of the Trustees Literature Committee. A sharing session followed and Conference members provided feedback on the first 6 chapters.

A final draft will be presented to the 2024 Conference Members. They will have 90-120 minutes to review the draft in a controlled environment.

Note: During the Zoom presentation, Clint M., Chair of the TABB subcommittee stated, the PLBB includes The Doctor's Opinion, first 164 pages of the book Alcoholics Anonymous, Appendices, equaling 190 pages, no personal stories will be included.

Note: Clint M. also noted the PLBB will contain the 12 steps, 12 traditions, 12 concepts. They will each be listed in their original wording and beside each one will be a plain language explanation of the step, tradition and/or concept.
